



Rules for the TMPCC Annual Car Show

Before you agree to attend our Annual Car Show, please read this document.

Our biggest event of the year is the TMPCC Annual Car Show held in conjunction with the Fireworks Festival at CBS Studio Center in Studio City, California every July 4th. This is an event for the entire family, with food, live entertainment, our car show and one of the best fireworks displays in Los Angeles.

- 1) There is no registration fee for our Annual Car Show. However, this is a charity event and the organizers charge \$20 per adult to enter the studio (children are less). Due to our arrangement with CBS, the owner of each display vehicle is granted one complementary admission.
- 2) CBS usually gives us room to display 80 to 100 vehicles each year. We will do our best to get you in the show, but it depends on how quickly you RSVP to our event invitations, which are forwarded in late May. It also depends on how many vehicles CBS allows us to display in any given year.
- 3) Holding spaces is not allowed. If you want to park together with friends, please arrive together and we will do our best to accommodate you. Our car shows are set up for the benefit of the spectators. Therefore we usually arrange cars so there is something interesting to see in each area of the show.
- 4) Vehicles are not allowed to move in or out of the display area once the show has started. If you arrive late, your vehicle will not make it in the show. This is for liability reasons, so none of the participants or spectators are injured by moving vehicles while the show is underway. Since this is a public event, arrival times and other information will be forwarded to members via email and posted on our Facebook page at least four weeks prior to the event.
- 5) Display vehicles are not allowed to leave early. However, if you have an emergency and must leave, see a TMPCC Officer (their badges have a bright orange bar on the bottom). If you are in an outside display area where no other vehicles need to be moved, two club officers will walk you and your vehicle off the property. However, if your vehicle is on display inside a sound stage, you will not be allowed to move it. This is due to the danger of moving several vehicles around on a sound stage crowded with people. In this instance, you will need to call a taxi or arrange alternate transportation to handle your emergency. Your vehicle will be secure on stage and you can pick it up after the event has concluded or you can pick it up the next day.
- 6) Vehicle display posters should state the year, make and model, as well as any other information you wish to share with the people who will view your vehicle. A 24 inch wide by 36 inch tall full color poster can be printed from your computer file at Fast Signs in Studio City. They are the print shop for the CBS Fireworks Festival. If you tell them you are having the posters printed for our car show at the festival, Fast Signs Studio City will offer you our club discount. The cost with club discount will be less than \$50 for a 24 inch by 36 inch full color poster professionally mounted to foam core board. You should also purchase an easel to display your poster. Remember to bring strong tape to affix your poster to the easel and also to affix the easel to the ground, that way the wind won't pick it up and blow it into any cars during the show.
- 7) If you don't want to go through the expense of having a professional poster printed, print a description sheet explaining your vehicle on a standard 8.5 inch by 11 inch sheet of paper and place it on your

windshield or passengers side window. To create your own vehicle display sign, you might want to start with our [Microsoft Word template](#), which can be downloaded [HERE](#). Then use clear tape to affix the paper display sign to your passenger's side window or windshield. Please bring your own tape to affix the description sheet to your vehicle.

8) We recommend that every display vehicle have a small fire extinguisher onboard. However, if you do not have one and you find a fire extinguisher necessary during the show, extinguishers will be available at the studio guard shack and/or on each stage where our vehicles are on display.

9) Trailers - Parking is extremely limited inside and outside the studio on event day. If you must bring a trailer, you will be directed to a parking area on the northeast side of the studio (approximately two blocks from the car show area). You must unload your vehicle and drive it or tow it from the trailer parking area to the car show display area. At the end of the day, you must drive or tow your car back to the trailer parking area, where you can load and leave. Haulers for any nitro methane or alcohol burning funny cars or dragsters that will be started at the event are an exception to this rule. This is because the starter motor and other things needed to start the cars, as well as the safety equipment to put out possible fires are in the haulers. Therefore we want the haulers close to where the cars will be started for convenience and safety. All other trailers and haulers must park, load and unload in the trailer parking area.

10) For Sale signs are NOT ALLOWED. If someone is admiring your vehicle, you are welcome to mention that it's for sale, but there are to be no visible markings or signs stating that the vehicle is for sale.

11) Food and drink won't be available until the show opens at 5PM. Since we arrive early for vehicle set up, you could find yourself thirsty before the show opens. Because of this, we recommend you bring something non-alcoholic to drink, like water, Gatorade, soft drinks, etc.

12) Remember to clean your vehicle or have it professionally detailed before the event. We hold one major car show each year, and we want our club to give the best possible impression to those in attendance. This includes any television stations, magazines or other media who might stop by to do interviews or stories about our club, our cars or our members. Since every car on display is automatically eligible to win one of the 20 CBS/TMPCC Award Certificates, the better your car looks, the better your chances of winning one of these prized awards.

13) Please keep the vehicle display areas clean. Pick up any trash you see in the vehicle display areas during the show and dispose of properly. We are guests of a television and motion picture studio and we hope you will respect the property as if it were your own. Throw trash and cigarette butts in the proper receptacles and clean up the stage and vehicle display areas at the end of the day. We would like the studio to welcome us back in the future.

14) The main objective of our events is to have fun. So have a great time and enjoy all the vehicles people have been nice enough to display so all of us can appreciate them.
